

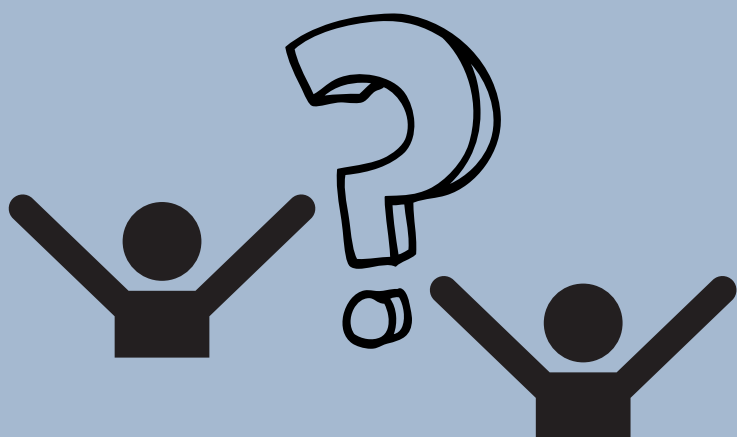
Morocco: managing the bodies of people who have died or disappeared during migration

There are significant differences between regions.
Practices are more structured in urban areas.
However, there are no national standards in Morocco.

Body recovery

Occasional at sea

Frequent on land (but dependent on local context)



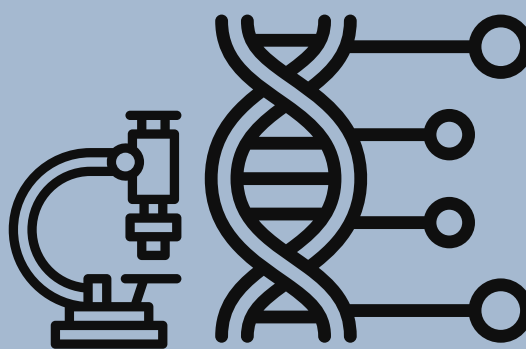
Body identification

Always subject to a missing persons report by the family:

- Occasional identification procedures for nationals
- Occasional identification procedures for foreigners

Data collection

Data collection **frequent**
(dependent on local context)



Occasional autopsies

Collection and archiving of post-mortem data: **frequent**
(depending on the local context)



Burials

Individualisation of burials: **occasional**
and dependent on local context

Tracing and location: **no information**

Repatriation of bodies: **occasional**

Issue of death certificates: **frequent and conditional on the family request**

Body search systems

For nationals: **no information**
For foreigners: **no information**
